

Erasmus+ Scholarships for Staff Mobility for Teaching or Training at Technical University of Munich (Erasmus+ International Dimension) 2020

The Technical University of Munich invites staff members for teaching or training purposes to apply for grants made available by the European Union under the international dimension of the Erasmus+ program.

Background and goals

- Initiating or strengthening collaboration between faculty members and researchers, e.g. for training purposes and/or collaboration in teaching
- Fostering institutional engagement with TUM, through exchange of best practice and development of new or existing formats of cooperation
- Enhancing existing student mobility, especially to increase incoming mobility to TUM
- To deepen existing ties with the two institutions, in particular through exchange of administrative and academic staff on departmental and central level

Funding possibilities and fundable duration of stay

- Staff Mobility for Training (**STT**): **minimum 5 days** (not including travel days)*
- Staff Mobility for Teaching (**STA**): **minimum 5 days** (not including travel days)* (**At least eight hours of lectures** must be held at TUM per week or part of a week.)
- Combined staff mobility for teaching and training (STA/STT) is also possible. Academic staff may propose a reduced teaching activity of 4 hours per week, if the teaching is combined with a training activity
- Please note that research activities cannot be funded. However a teaching stay (STA) can be combined with a research stay.
- Stay abroad must occur within the timeframe between **April 2020 and June 2021**

Eligibility

- Professional and academic staff members of the partner university who are in a position of getting an official authorization of business travel
- Applications will be accepted from staff employed directly by The University of Queensland and who may be approved by their department for official business travel.
- Evidence of proof of employment may be requested.
- UQ outbound staff must comply with the [UQ Travel Management Policy](#) (UQ Login Required)

Support

- 160 € per day
- 1.500 € travel expenses from Australia
- Please be aware that the Erasmus+ Program provides no insurance. It is the staff member's responsibility to insure herself/himself for the whole duration of the stay (medical,

UQ Application and selection process

- accident and liability insurance).
- UQ staff who receive Erasmus+ funding will be eligible for [UQ Travel Insurance](#) while undertaking authorised UQ Business. (UQ Login Required)
- Additional associated costs incurred by the applicant above and beyond Erasmus+ funding awarded will be the responsibility of the approving Faculty, School, Institute or Unit at UQ.
- Applications must be submitted to the UQ Global Engagement & Entrepreneurship Office.

No direct applications to TUM will be accepted.

- The application should include following documents:
 - copy of ID/Passport
 - CV
 - application form including project description and time schedule
 - a letter or email of invitation from a TUM staff member
 - a proof of employment at UQ
